

Recruitment rules for summer schools - PROM project

Basic information

The project involves organizing two summer schools, each lasting nine days (including two days of travel to the school site), aimed at participation of international students and doctoral students interested in developing academic, social, leadership, and intercultural competencies. The program for both schools involves intensive workshop sessions, the development of practical skills, and the creation of lasting educational outcomes using audiovisual tools.

The first school (School of Academic Leadership) will focus on developing leadership, project management, and social competences. Participants will take part in managing academic initiatives workshops, team communication, promoting scientific activities, and building international cooperation. A key element of the program will be classes on agency in the academic community, the role of institutions supporting the autonomy of students and doctoral candidates, as well as reflection sessions on the functioning of university structures. Participants will analyze good practices, present their own initiatives, and the collaborative effort will result in a Charter of Good Practices for Supporting Subjectivity in Academic Communities – a document developed based on the workshop results and the exchange of experiences. Concurrently, participants will participate in professional training in the creation of audiovisual materials, covering the basics of working with image, sound, narration, and editing. As part of the course, original films will be created – short multimedia productions documenting participants' reflections, projects, and developed values, serving as a tool for disseminating the school's results.

The second school (*Summer School for the Promotion of Democratic Values, University of Gdańsk*) will focus on promoting democratic values in academia and society. Participants will take part in lectures, seminars, panel discussions, and study visits to public institutions, learning about the mechanisms of social participation, the functioning of local democracy, and the importance of civic engagement. Participants' reflections will be captured in multimedia format, including video presentations and team projects, created under the supervision of specialists as part of a separate training module.

Both schools will be held in Gdańsk – a city of exceptional symbolic and historical significance, the cradle of democratic change and the Solidarity movement. The context of the venue will play an important role in the teaching process, inspiring participants to reflect on academic responsibility, individual rights, and the role of community.

Project goals

The organization of the schools will be a crucial tool in achieving the project's goals: developing the competencies of young citizens, strengthening the internationalization of university activities, and supporting active and informed participation in academic and social life. The resulting film, good practice charter, and workshop experiences will contribute to the consolidation of the project's results and the dissemination of the developed content internationally.

Schools will enable the real formation of a new generation of social leaders capable of critical thinking, intercultural cooperation and initiating responsible changes in their communities in accordance with democratic values

Recruitment may be undertaken only by a person with a student status (bachelors, masters or uniform master's studies) or with a current doctoral student status on the day of joining the recruitment process and throughout the entire mobility period, as well as declaring knowledge of English at a level not lower than B2.

The form contains questions about:

- personal and contact information;
- justification for the connection between mobility and the field of study;
- cover letter written in English (max 5000 characters).

The form must be completed and sent by March 10, 2026

The order in which places are awarded depends on the total number of points obtained – applications with a higher total of points have priority when awarding places and will be processed in accordance with the ranking list.

Meeting all formal criteria is a necessary condition for qualifying for substantive assessment.

Recruitment results

The committee verifying and assessing applications is to prepare a ranking list divided into:

- applicants who have qualified (and will receive funding),
- reserve list (will receive funding if applicants who qualified withdraw within 7 days of the recruitment process closing),
- ineligible applicants (did not meet the criteria or received too low a score).

All persons participating in the recruitment process will be individually informed about its results by email by March 18, 2026.

Funding

The trip funding consists of the following elements (lump sums): The funding must cover travel, accommodation and subsistence costs.
